Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- Lead IT system security consultation and audits within cloud-based environments in accordance with NIST SP 800-53, 800-37, OMB, and other authoritative IT security guidance
- Develop System Security Plans, Configuration Management, IT Contingency, and Incident Response Plans in accordance with NIST requirements.
- Prepare, review, and/or update, and maintain IT Security supporting artifacts.
- Provide IT security guidance to Information System Owners
- Identify information security problems and challenges, research and develop technical solutions to rectify them.
- Perform audits utilizing the examine, interview, and test procedures in accordance with NIST SP 800-53A Revision 4.
- Ensure cybersecurity policies are adhered to and that required controls are implemented.
- Validate respective information system security plans to ensure NIST control requirements are met.
- Author recommendations associated with your findings on how to improve the customer's security posture in accordance with NIST controls.
